- The Bible is God's special book. It tells us how much He loves us.
- The Bible has 4 Gospels written by Matthew, Mark, Luke and John. They tell us about Jesus' life.
- The Parish family listens to God's Word when they hear readings from the Bible.

Year 1&2 Year B: Topic 5 - Eucharist: Thanksgiving

What should I already know?

- the joy of gathering together to celebrate at Mass
- Sunday is a special day for the church family
- Families and groups share special meals
- The bread and wine shared at Mass is Jesus' special meal

Vocabulary

thanksgiving	Being grateful for what we have been given
Eucharist	The part of the Mass when we remember the Last Supper
Eucharistic Prayer	the priest takes the place of Jesus and says special prayers over the bread and wine so that they become the body and blood
liturgy	A special time when people gather together to worship and give thanks

Scripture

The night before he died, Jesus and his friends went to Jerusalem to celebrate a special meal together. While they were at table, Jesus took some bread, gave thanks to God, broke it and gave it out to his friends. He said, "Take and eat. This is my body, given for you. Do this in memory of me."

In the same way, Jesus took a cup of wine. He gave thanks, and gave it to them saying, "Take and drink. This is my blood shed for you."

Year 1&2 Year B: Topic 6 Lent/Easter: Giving - Opportunities

Big Question:

How does each day offer opportunities for good?

What should I already know?

- Ash Wednesday is the first day of Lent.
- Jesus died on the cross on Good Friday.
- On Easter Sunday, we celebrate the day Jesus rose from the dead.



Scripture

Then he poured some water into a washbasin and began to wash the disciples' feet and dry them with the towel around his waist.

John 13:5

I have set an example for you, so that you will do just what I have done for you.

John 13:15

When they had finished making fun of him, they took off the purple robe and put his own clothes back on him. Then they led him out to crucify him.

What we want to remember.

- Every day we should try to do something good.
- On Ash Wednesday, a cross of ash is put on the forehead as a sign we are followers of Jesus.
- At the Last Supper, Jesus washed the feet of his disciples to remind us to serve each other.
- The Stations of the Cross tell the story of Good Friday

Year 1&2 Year B: Topic 7 Pentecost: Serving - Spread the Word

Big Question:

Why should we spread Good News?

What should I already know?

- Jesus went back to his father in heaven.
- The Holy Spirit was sent to be our friend and guide us at Pentecost

“Why are you looking among the dead for one who is alive? He is not here; he has been raised.

Luke 1: 5 – 6

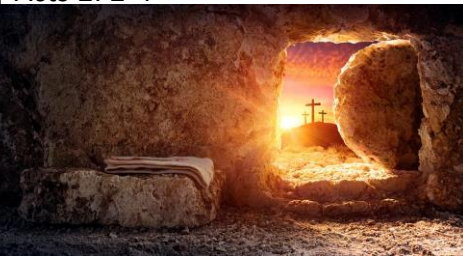
As he was blessing them, he departed from them and was taken up into heaven. They worshiped him and went back into Jerusalem, filled with great joy.

What we want to remember.

- When Jesus went back to heaven, he promised to send the Holy Spirit
- The Apostles started to spread the Good News about Jesus at Pentecost.
- We can pray to the Holy Spirit if we or anyone else needs help.
- Jesus promised people new life in heaven when they die.
- We can pass on the Good News by being loving and caring.

Year 1&2 Year B: Topic 8 Reconciliation – Rules

What should I already know?

- God helps us to make right choices
- If we make a wrong choice, we need to say sorry
- We should forgive other people if they say sorry to us.
- God will forgive us if we are sorry for the wrong choices we make

Vocabulary

choice	we choose between one thing and another
consequence	what happens because of an action we make
examination of conscience	when we think about the things we have done wrong
forgive	to decide not to be angry or upset with someone if they have hurt you
sin	something that someone says or does that hurts God.

What we want to remember.

- God gave us rules to help us live well together.
- If we do something wrong that makes God sad, it is called a sin.
- We can say sorry at church for things we have done wrong. It is called Reconciliation.
- The priest forgives the person who says sorry in Jesus' name.
- At church we give the sign of peace to show we want to live like Jesus teaches us.

Muslims pray 5 times a day



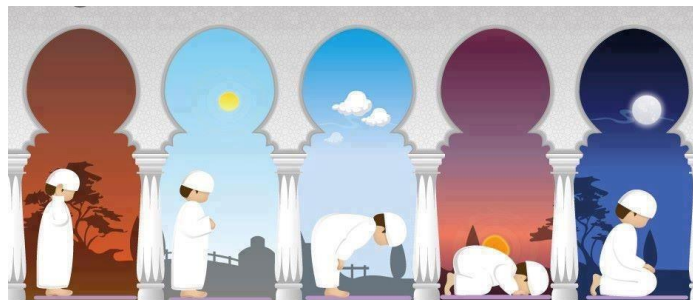
Muhammad in Arabic
