

Year 3&4 Year B: Topic 1 Domestic Church: Family - People

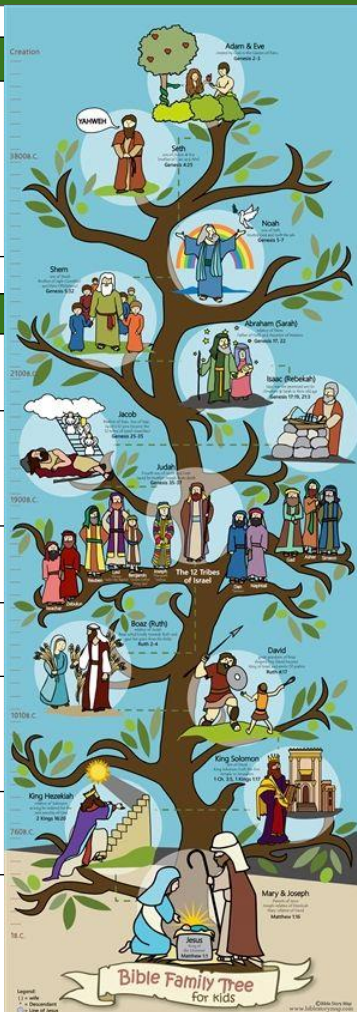
Big Question:

What we want to remember.

- Jesus had a human family and the first of his descendants was Abraham.
- Abraham teaches us to have faith in God and to listen to what he asks us to do.
- The Ancestors of Jesus teach us how to follow the Word of God in our words and our actions.
- The Book of Proverbs contains wise sayings to help us live our lives.

- A sacrament is a sign of God's love. He is saying, "I am with you and I love you."
- In Confirmation, the person being confirmed makes their own promises that they will follow God and be like Jesus.
- At Confirmation, the person being confirmed is strengthened by the gift of the Holy Spirit.

What should I already know?

- Advent is a time of waiting and preparing to celebrate Jesus coming at Christmas.
- Jesus was sent to us because God loves us.
- Although Jesus came to Earth at Christmas, he is still among us.

You who bring good news to Zion, go up on a high mountain.
You who bring good news to Jerusalem, lift up your voice with a shout, lift it up, do not be afraid; say to the towns of Judah, "Here is your God!"

What should I already know?

- Jesus chose 12 Apostles to help him
- The priest leads the community in Church
- People come together at Church to celebrate
- There are many people who help in Church.



What we want to remember.

- The parish is a Christian Community. Our parish church is Our Lady of Perpetual Help.
- People within the parish family serve the community
- We are called to be loving members of a community, reaching out to, and serving, others.
- A funeral in church is a celebration of a Christian's life.

commitment	being dedicated (sticking to) a cause or activity
Extraordinary ministers	a member of the Parish community (not a priest or deacon) who can distribute Holy Communion
laity	the people who go to church - parishioners
ministry	the work of the priest. Jesus also had his ministry when on earth
parish	an area with its own church
rites	a religious ceremony or act
service	helping or doing work for someone
Funeral rites	the traditional words and actions used in a service when someone dies

Year 3&4 Year B: Topic 5 - Eucharist: Giving and Receiving

Big Question:
What's more important - giving or receiving?

What should I already know?

- That Eucharist means 'Thanksgiving'
- Listening and sharing with one another is an important part of our school and Christian lives
- We can listen to the Word of God and share in Holy Communion at Mass
- Listening and sharing has a cost but can also be a joy

Vocabulary

Mass	A special service where people come together to celebrate and receive Holy Communion
Liturgy of the Word	The part of the Mass where we listen to readings from the bible and the gospels
Eucharist	The part of the Mass when we remember the Last Supper
Liturgy of the Eucharist	The part of the Mass where the priest takes the place of Jesus and says special prayers over the bread and wine so that they become the body and blood
Penitential Act	We confess our sins and tell God that with His help we will try to be better in the future
Lamb of God	A special name for Jesus, which shows that we understand that he sacrificed himself for us.

What we want to remember.

- The Holy Spirit gave Peter and John the courage to speak out; we are given courage when we need it.
- The Holy Spirit gave Paul new life and the ability to spread the news of Jesus.
- Like the disciples, we are called to spread the Good News about Jesus.
- We can call on the Holy Spirit to help us if we need him.

Peter and John speak before the council - Acts 4 : 1-26

Acts 8: 26 – 38 – Philip and the Ethiopian.

Year 3&4 Year B: Topic 8 Reconciliation – Building Bridges

What should I already know?

- God's laws help us to make the right choice about how to live our lives.
- If we make a mistake and are sorry, then God will always forgive us.

absolution	forgiveness for something said or done wrong
Confession	admit to doing or saying something wrong
Examination of conscience	think carefully about anything that you have said or done wrong and need to say sorry for
penance	an action to show that you are sorry for someone
sin	a thought, words or action that hurt God
Sacrament of Reconciliation	A sacrament in the church that helps bring us closer to God when we have done wrong
repentance	showing that you are sorry for something

What we want to remember.

- The Parable of the Lost sheep reminds us that God will always call us to go back to him.
- The Holy Spirit works in us to help us to recognise when we have done wrong and need to say sorry.
- When we say sorry to God, we need to truly mean it. This is called confession.
- When we talk to the priest about what we have done wrong, we are talking to Jesus.
- The priest can forgive us our sins and this is called absolution. He forgives us in Jesus' name.



Year 3&4 Year B: Topic 9 World: God's people.

Big Question:

Why do some people do extraordinary things?

What should I already know?

- The Earth, everything and everyone in it are gifts from God and we must respect and care for them.
- We have a duty to act to preserve the Earth.
- People make pilgrimages to places which are special in their religion.

Scripture

You are the people of God; he loved you and chose you for his own. So then, you must clothe yourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness, and patience. Be tolerant with one another and forgive one another whenever any of you has a complaint against someone else. You must forgive one another just as the Lord has forgiven you.

What we want to remember.

- Saints help us to see God and to know how to follow in His ways.
- We are called to be saints by living in the way Jesus taught us.
- Ordinary people can do extraordinary things inspired by God: Saint Mother Theresa and Martin Luther King are examples of such people.
- Some people have lived their life in the way Jesus taught even when it has led to their death – they are called martyrs.

Y3

- The muslim place of worship is called a Mosque
- Friday is a special day for Muslims
- Muslims are called to pray during the midday prayer on a Friday

- The 99 names of God are a tribute to God's greatness

- The Shahadah is a special prayer for Muslims
- Ramadan is a time when adult Muslims fast
- Id-ul-Fitr is a special festival that marks the end of Ramadan
- Id-ul-Adha is celebrated in honor of Prophet Ibrahim's loyalty to Allah
- Hajj is a special pilgrimage.

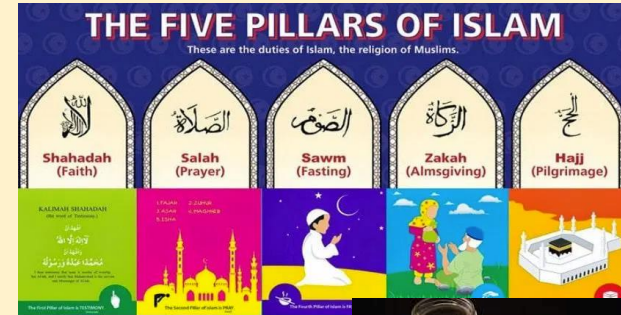

Y3

- The Jewish place of worship is called the synagogue.

Y4

- The Holy Book for Jews is called the Torah. This is the first 5 books of the Old Testament
- The Torah is hand-written on a scroll.

Y5

- Pesach or Passover is a major Jewish holiday that celebrates the Biblical story of the Israelites escape from slavery in Egypt
- Special foods are eaten at the Pesach Meal

Y6

- Rosh Hashanah is the Jewish New Year
- Yom Kippur is the most solemn of Jewish religious holidays, when Jews say sorry to God for what they have done wrong.
